On behalf of the Prince Henry Society – New Bedford Chapter we would request that the New Bedford City Council support a petition to instruct the Park Board to consider rededicating the northwest area on Pope's Island that is currently generally known as "Marine Park", as **Prince Henry "The Navigator" Park – on Pope's Island**.

The Prince Henry Society was founded in 1980 by the late Milton Ferreira, Anthony S. Catojo, Jr. and Gabriel "Gabe" Moura to preserve the contribution of the Portuguese in America and also to be of service to the Greater New Bedford community. Over the last 35 years, our 501 (c) (3) non-profit Society has provided many important contributions to the region, including:

- Awarding scholarships to over 500 students in an aggregate amount in excess of \$700,000
- Feeding countless numbers of local families and people in need, including an annual "Feed the Needy" event, and the distribution of food baskets at Christmas
- Providing hundreds of thousands of dollars in charitable funds to support valuable community organizations, including the active annual support of the Junior Achievement program amongst many others
- Participating in countless cultural events throughout the region
- Provide Humanitarian Relief Funds to many areas adversely impacted by natural disasters

- Honoring and recognizing outstanding people in our community with targeted awards, such as Distinguished Service, Brotherhood, Recognition, and Person of the Year
- Holding blood drives on a yearly basis to help stock the local blood bank at St. Luke's Hospital

A similarly important contribution to the region was also erecting the monument of Prince Henry "The Navigator" at Pope's Island on July 31, 1994 to celebrate the contributions of all immigrants who came to New Bedford's shores, as often the final destination of their journeys of hope. The Navigator project, which was officially approved by the Park Board on October 21, 1992 (see attachment for reference), cost in excess of \$200,000 that the Society absorbed entirely with investments from its individual Members. The Statue itself was designed and sculpted by Jose Joaquim Rodrigues, who is one of the most important names in the Portuguese contemporaneous art, both in Portugal as well as abroad, and was brought to the New Bedford shore to then be assembled on top of a 10' concrete pedestal constructed by local craftsman.

Thereafter, the City Council on January 13, 1997 (see attachment for reference) approved the acceptance of The Navigator statue as a City asset, through a gift from the Society that is subject to 5 specific transfer conditions (see agreement attached for reference.)

Prince Henry (Henrique) the Navigator (1394-1460) was the patron of explorers and the most important figure in the beginning of the European worldwide explorations, including one of the first to employ cartographers to help chart navigation voyages and thus pioneering navigational sciences. Just as importantly, Prince Henry was likewise described as a person with no luxuries, not avaricious, speaking with soft words and calm
