I send this letter in an effort to eliminate any possible confusion regarding the status of the Memorandum of Understanding among the City of New Bedford, New Bedford Public Schools, and Alma del Mar Charter School, approved by me as the Commissioner of Elementary and Secondary Education effective March 12, 2019 (the "MOU"). I previously determined that the necessary legislation had not been enacted in sufficient time for the planning and implementation of the charter school contemplated by the MOU. Therefore, I terminated the MOU, consistent with Section 26, on May 31, 2019. Attached is the letter that I sent to this effect.

Dear Mayor Mitchell, Superintendent Anderson, and Mr. Gardner:

First, I would like to thank you for working together in a spirit of collaboration and genuine partnership that focused on the best interest of all students in New Bedford. I commend your efforts to develop an innovative model that would have done precisely what charter school critics have challenged charter schools to do: admit and serve all students in a neighborhood rather than admitting students who submit their names for a citywide lottery.

Unfortunately, however, I have determined that the necessary legislation that is required for this compromise to go into effect has not been enacted in sufficient time for New Bedford families to plan for September, nor will it move forward on a timeline that would allow sufficient time for the planning and implementation of this innovative school model. Thus, the January 22, 2019 vote of the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education granting Alma del Mar Charter School an enrollment increase of 594 will now take effect.
