Damages From July 22, 2017 Fire

Dear Mr. Romanowicz:

Information contained herein is provided to document conditions that you and I observed during our exterior inspection of the subject building on July 22, 2017 as the New Bedford Fire Department was concluding firefighting efforts.



FRONT ELEVATION - FACING NORTHEAST

As shown in the photo above, the entire roof of the building collapsed due to the fire. Photos 1 through 6 on Page 2 herein show that both exterior and interior wall studs and framing components were also severely charred by fire. While you and 1 observed many areas of compromised wall framing during our exterior inspection, Photos 5 & 6 are among various photos provided by the insurance adjuster company Marinilli Associates that indicated similar damages were prevalent inside other areas of the building.

Several photos of the subject building that I obtained on February 3, 2020 indicate that conditions are essentially unchanged since the July 22, 2017 fire. Photos 7 & 8 on Page 3 herein show that the attic dormer at the front of the building has collapsed downward a little more since the fire, but that all other conditions are the same as they were 2½ years ago on the day of the fire. Photo 9 shows that the current conditions along the left side of the building are essentially identical to those shown in the photo above. And Photo 10 shows that three second floor windows along the right side of the building have been removed and the openings remain uncovered.

A summary of conditions is that several major structural components and systems of the building have collapsed or have been severely compromised beyond feasibility of repair. Since the building remains open to the weather, these components are susceptible to further deterioration that could result in further collapse. Loose material atop the roof that could become airborne debris further renders the building unsafe since it could endanger the safety of people in the vicinity of the building. I accordingly recommend that the subject building be demolished as soon as possible.

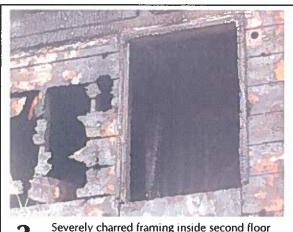

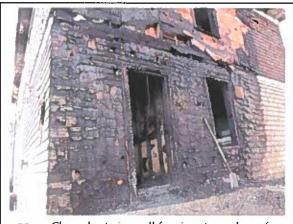
