The Massachusetts Shannon Community Safety Initiative and the Safe & Successful Youth Initiative are grants that provide funds to the City of New Bedford to combat gang violence by working with at-risk and proven risk youth ages 10-24 years of age. Programs work collaboratively with law enforcement, public schools, and local community agencies.
