OUR COMMITTEE IS MOSTLY COMPRISED OF LOCAL AREA HIGH SCHOOL & COLLEGE ATHLETES AREA COACHES, TEACHERS AND EDUCATORS. THOMAS BARAO WAS THE GREATEST of ALL NEW BEDFORD HIGH SCHOOLS BASKETBALL PLAYERS. HE HELD THE SCHOOLS SCORING TITLE FOR OVER 30 YEARS.HE LEAD THE CRIMSON TIDE TO TWO GREATER BOSTON LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS CAPTURING A "MVP" AWARD ALONG THE WAY.

IN 1968 HE LEAD THE CRIMSON TO THE TECH TOURNEY CHAMPIONSHIP GAME. TOM HAD A TOURNMENT RECORD 29 REBOUNDS ONE GAME. HE WAS ONE OF THE FIRST PIONEERS THAT PUT THE CITY OF NEW BEDFORD & N.B.H.S. ON the MAP IN MASSACHUETTS. TOM WAS INDUCTED IN THE NEW BEDFORD HIGH SCHOOLS BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME. HE WAS A McDONALDS ALL AMERICAN AND UPON GRADUATION IN 1968 ATTENDED the UNIVERSITY of WISCONSIN ON A BASKETBALL SCHOLARSHIP. HE LATER FINISHED HIS EDUCATION AND BASKETBALL CAREER AT U.R.I. IN PROVIDENCE R.I. TOM THEN CAME BACK TO NEW BEDFORD AND TAUGHT

SCHOOL AND BECAME an ASST. COACH AT N.B.H.S. THROUGHOUT HIS LIFETIME HE WORKED FOR THE CITY OF NEW BEDFORD AS A PARK ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPT. AS WE,LL AS A LIFEGUARD AT EAST BEACH,. TOM REFFED AND COACHED MANY 100,S OF KIDS WHO LOOKED UP TO HIM BECAUSE OF HIS TREMENDOUS BASKETBALL TALENTS AND HIS ILLUSTIOUS CAREER.

THOMAS WAYNE BAROA DIED AT THE AGE OF 67 YEARS ON MARCH 31ST.,2017. HE STARTED HIS CAREER AT "ASHLEY PARK" at A VERY EARLY AGE AROUND 1960-61. HE SPENT COUNTLESS HOURS AND YEARS OF PRACTICE PERFECTING HIS SKILLS TO BECOME THE OUTSTANDING PLAYER, MAN AND FATHER THAT HE WAS. TOM STILL SPENT MANY YEARS AFTER HIGH SCHOOL & COLLEGE PLAYING BALL AT "ASHLEY PARK".
