Attached, for your review, is correspondence related to the above referenced sewer abatement request.

The circumstances associated with this request have been investigated by the Department of Public Infrastructure, Wastewater Division. As a result of the investigation, the hot water pipe that ran underneath the concrete slab ruptured and started leaking significant amounts of water unbeknownst to the homeowner. Once he received the first high bill, he called a plumber who then re-routed the hot water from the hot water heater through a CPVC (chlorinated polyvinyl chloride) pipe. None of the water that was pouring out underneath the concrete slab made its way back into the collection system. I would recommend that a credit of \$690.36 be allowed.

Should you be in agreement, I would ask that you communicate the abatement recommendation to the City Council.



In the month of September, I received a Water and Sewer Invoice - Bill number - 1845958 of the amount of \$996.50. I called DPI and they sent someone over, but he could not see where the water was going to as my house was built on a slab in 1956 and the pipes are all underneath the slab. I also called my insurance company to see if they could help me with anything, and again since they could not see any water they too could not help, even though they both agreed that there was a problem because the dial on the meter was going at an alarming rate. I called a plumber and after buying a new water tank and a new mixing valve, it was determined that in fact there was a broken pipe underneath the cement slab. So my 2 choices was, either jack hammer my kitchen floor to find the broken pipe or re-route all together. I went with the latter and re-routed the pipe and the problem is now fixed. During the time that all this issue was going on, I turned off the main to the water to prevent any damage from happening. I not even a year moved in, into my new home and I'm trying to be as proactive as possible to protect my investment as we love where we live. Any help in resolving this large bill situation will be greatly appreciated.

Requesting, that in light of the recent discarded needle epidemic on our City streets, public parks and playgrounds, that the City of New Bedford engage the New Bedford Police Department, New Bedford Health Department, Neighborhoods United, Operation Clean Sweep representatives and representatives of both Southcoast Health System and Hawthorn Medical Associates about forming a "Neighborhood Needle Recovery" program similar to what is currently being instituted in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, the "Neighborhood Needle Recovery" Program recovers needles quickly and safely in a number of ways, including, supplying needle drop boxes throughout our Downtown and other high-traffic areas in the City, conducting regular needle sweeps on school grounds and parks and in locations affected by high volumes of discarded needles, recording where and how many needles are discarded in public places, and coordinating needle pick-up with community groups, the purpose of this program is to not only insure that our streets, public parks and playgrounds are safe and secure from potentially dangerous discarded needles, but that we also will have created a system which encourages intravenous drug users to discard needles appropriately. RELATIVE TO THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS

31- 509

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of New Bedford as follows:—

SECTION 1.

Section 18-1 of Chapter 18 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by striking said section in its entirety and inserting, in place thereof, the following section:-

Sec. 18-1. Board of Park Commissioners – Establishment.

There shall be a Board of Park Commissioners consisting of 5 members, one of whom shall be the Commissioner of the Department of Public Infrastructure or the Commissioner's designee.

The Commissioner of the Department of Public Infrastructure or the Commissioner's designee shall first serve pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 18-2.

Section 2. Section 18-2 of Chapter 18 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by inserting, at the end thereof, the following paragraphs:-

The Commissioner of the Department of Public Infrastructure or the Commissioner's designee shall first become a member of the Board of Park Commissioners by filling the first vacancy to occur either by resignation or by expiration of a current park commissioner's term on or after December 1, 2018.

If one or more park commissioners are serving on the Board under an expired term as a result of no replacement having been duly appointed and qualified at the time this ordinance becomes effective, the mayor shall, within 30 days, appoint the Commissioner of the Department of Public Infrastructure or the Commissioner's designee to replace the park commissioner whose term has expired and choose which park commissioner will be replaced if more than one is serving under an expired term without confirmation of the city council. The mayor however shall provide notice to the city council of the effective date of the appointment.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 43 of the General Laws.

In accordance with the requirements of the New Bedford City Code, Article XI, Section 2-157 Demolition of Buildings, the Preservation Planner, designated to act on behalf of the New Bedford Historical Commission, has examined the structure located at the above-captioned site in order to determine its historical significance and whether it is in the public interest to preserve such structure.

Having reviewed the application for demolition I offer the following findings and recommendation in this matter to the New Bedford City Council:

- The structure is not located in a National Register Historic District.
- The structure has historic significance due to its association with the growth of neighborhoods in response to burgeoning textile industry in the late 19th century.
- The structure is in poor condition due to extensive deferred maintenance and there is no practical end-use for the building due to its location.
- Restoration or preservation efforts would be impractical due to the existing condition of the structure.

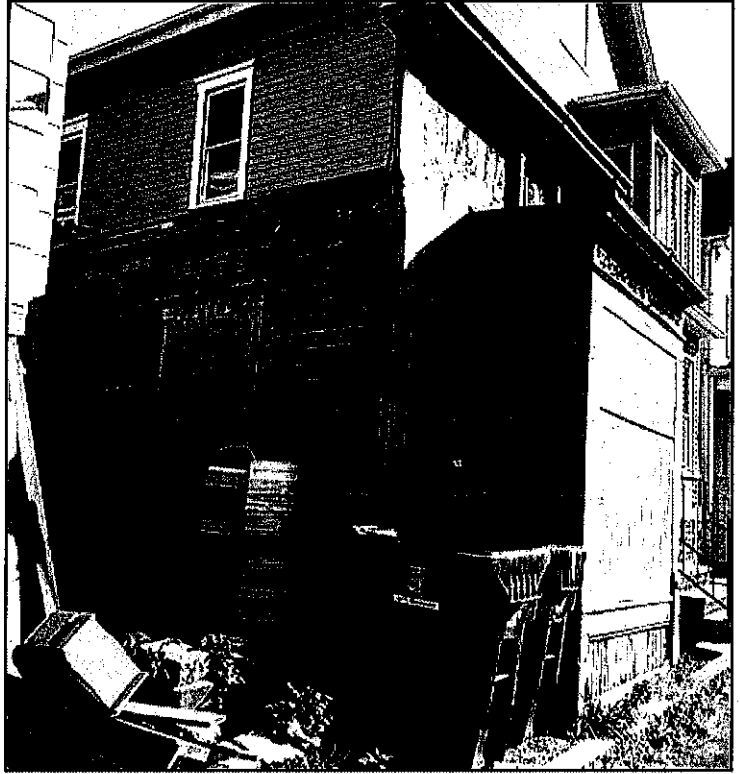
In light of these findings, the Preservation Planner has determined that the structure at 248 Purchase Street is neither Historically Significant nor a Preferably Preserved Structure.

248 Purchase Street Demolition Request



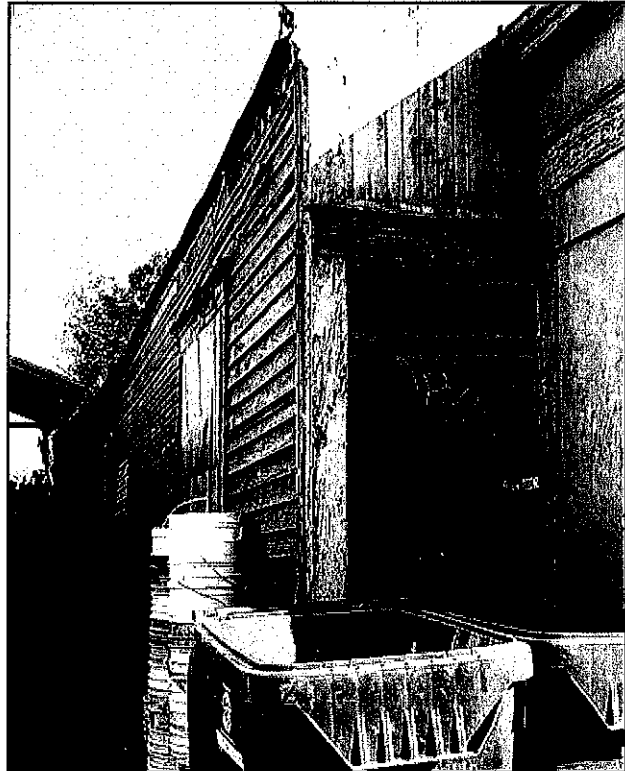
